INTRODUCTION

We are excited to present to you the impact campaign and report for the documentary [We Are Guardians](#), which aims to address the urgent and critical challenges facing the Amazon Rainforest. We Are Guardians is directed by Indigenous activist and filmmaker Edivan Guajajara, environmental filmmakers Chelsea Greene and Rob Grobman, and produced by Academy Award winner Fisher Stevens. With Leonardo DiCaprio joining as an Executive Producer, the film has already garnered significant attention and is primed to catalyze global action to protect the Amazon.

About the film:

Indigenous forest guardian Marçal Guajajara and activist Puyr Tembé fight tirelessly to protect their ancestral lands from the relentless waves of deforestation. On the other side - Valdir, an illegal logger is trapped in a desperate struggle to make ends meet and sees no other way to survive than continuing to cut down the forest. Through a tapestry of perspectives, We Are Guardians follows these we see the economic connections to markets that link goods derived in the Amazon region to consumers around the world.

MISSION AND VISION

Mission:

At the heart of our campaign lies a profound mission: to empower the unsung heroes of the Amazon, the Indigenous Forest Guardians. Together, we aim to fortify its resilience, inspire regeneration, and safeguard its legacy for generations to come.

Vision:

A thriving Amazon Rainforest, safeguarded by empowered Guardians, preserved for future generations through a unified global effort.



IMPACT

We want to start with exciting news: "We Are Guardians" has successfully secured a **distribution agreement with NETFLIX for Brazil and the entire Latin American region**. Our team is working tirelessly to ensure the film's timely delivery, with an anticipated Netflix release in the beginning of 2024, exact date yet to be determined. In addition to this digital distribution, we retain the ability to host in-person screenings across Latin America. Plans are underway for a series of impactful events next year, aimed at amplifying awareness and engagement with the film's message.

We also won "Best Documentary" at Raindance Film Festival, and "Audience Award of Best Documentary" at Mostra Film Festival in S o Paulo. We also won the "Creative Activism Award" from Cultures of Resistance, a cash prize of \$10,000 for the forest guardians of the Temb  and Guajajara to purchase technology, transportation, and equipment for M dia Ind gena.

The first 6-months of the We Are Guardians impact campaign have been productive and filled with advancements for the greater outreach of the film and the overall goals to help support the Indigenous communities of the Temb , Guajajara, and the Amazon. We want to lay out some of the highlights from all sides of the initiative and share our goals for the next phases of the campaign.

IMPACT CAMPAIGN GOALS

Empowerment of Indigenous Forest Guardians and Communities

Empower Indigenous Forest Guardians with tools, technology, and training to protect and reforest the Amazon. Educate communities in sustainable practices, like agroforestry and solar energy, for autonomy and financial independence.

Educational Outreach and Storytelling for Change

Distribute a Guardians Toolkit and educational materials for change. Launch "Futura Amazonia" media platform with Indigenous filmmakers for environmental stories. Provide curriculum guides to 2 million U.S. educators to foster future guardians.

Global Screening Tour for Amplified Impact

Conduct a global screening tour with Indigenous leaders to engage audiences, policymakers, and influencers, using diverse strategies for widespread awareness and action for Amazon protection.

LAYING THE FOUNDATION

The directors, **Chelsea, Edivan** and **Rob** have taken on the full time responsibility of coordinating the first 6 months of the Impact Campaign. In August we hired **Maíra Irigaray** as our Brazilian Impact Campaign Director. With Maira's extensive experience in the region working with Indigenous people in the Amazon and NGOs like Amazon Watch and the Environmental Investigation Agency, and her long, impassioned commitment to the Amazonian issue, we were incredibly excited for her to join our team. She truly understands the sensitivities and patience it requires to work with Indigenous communities and has seen firsthand how the work of NGOs, while it has its place, often falls short in not truly bringing support to the people that need it most—an area where we hope to truly differentiate ourselves. We are also supported by **Laysa Mathias**, an incredible producer from Alter do Chão, who was with us filming in Arariboia and is invaluable in helping with communication and successful implementation of projects in the territories and screening events. **Megan Friend** and **Amna Vega** have continued to support from the Random Good team with coordinating screenings, social media and were a core component of developing our campaign goals.

SUPPORT THE GUARDIANS

So far we have raised a total of \$26,420 for the guardians:
\$10,000 from a grant
\$13,420 from GoFundMe
\$3,000 from other donations

We have already delivered \$7,000 to the Guajajara guardians. We are solidifying plans with the Temb  and expect to be able to deliver supplies for them by the beginning of 2024.

Mar al's group of guardians of the Zutiwa village used the donations to do a 2 week patrol of the territory, where they found evidence of new invasions, confiscated logging tools, and submitted evidence to the police. They will use the next incoming donations to buy a motorcycle to facilitate faster transportation to areas of invasion.

United Nations Permanent Forum For Indigenous Affairs

April 17th, 2023, New York City

The event featured clips of the film interwoven in a panel discussion to help delegates understand the current situation in the Amazon. The event was a great success with a packed room and special guests including Brazilian Indigenous supermodel, Zaya, and Indigenous climate activist from Chad Hindou Oumarou Ibrahim.



Screening at UNDP Headquarters

June 5th, 2023, New York City

With our new friends Nina Kantcheva and Anna Medri we screened at UNDP HQ for members of UNDP and friends, followed by an emotional panel with Puyr, Edivan, Rob and Chelsea.

Screening in Belém for Indigenous Communities

August 5th, 2023, Belém, Brazil

For the first private screening in Brazil, we organized a screening for 30 Tembé and 20 Guajajara who had traveled hundreds of miles from their villages for the summit. Working with SESC, a Brazil-wide cultural institution, we booked a small historic theater by the Amazon River docks in Belém. It was Marçal's first time meeting Puyr, and Edivan's first time showing the film to his parents and siblings, which was incredibly emotional and impactful.



Amazon Summit, Belém, Pará Brazil

August 7th, 2023

In collaboration with Avaaz, The Nature Conservancy, the Ministry of Indigenous Peoples, and Mighty Earth, we hosted an exclusive screening during the Cúpula da Amazônia summit meeting in Belém. Amongst the 200 Indigenous and political leaders in attendance were Minister Sonia Guajajara, Congresswoman Célia Xakriabá, the President of IBAMA (Brazil's environmental police force) Rodrigo Agostinho, the heads of Conservation International, ReWild, the Rainforest Trust, and the Nature Conservancy. The Guardians from both Arariboia and Alto Rio Guama Territories were also in attendance and were so touched to feel how much the audience loves them and appreciates their work.

NYC UN Climate Week

September 13 - 24th, 2023, New York City

During the UN NYC Climate week with Edivan and Puyr in attendance, we accomplished the following:

- A special presentation and panel at the Brazilian Consulate for Consulate staff and Indigenous community members.



- A full screening of the film at Open Society Foundation for 70 of their staff members and greater community with an in-depth panel.

Policy Meetings and Screenings in Washington, DC

September 25th - 28th, 2023

With the help of Amazon Watch and EIA, we initiated discussions with key representatives at USAID and the U.S. Department of Justice. The DOJ expressed interest in an investigation for incoming wood imports from the Amazon after hearing Puyr and Edivan's testimony.

One of the highlights of our visit was a special 30-minute screening in person and online at the **U.S. Department of State**. This momentous occasion provided us with a platform to convey the urgency of our cause to influential policymakers and diplomats. **We also hosted a screening in the US Congress.**

Our engagement extended to both sides of the aisle, as we met with Republican and Democratic representatives from the Senate Finance Committee. Additionally, we had productive discussions with the staff members of several esteemed legislators, including Senator Welch, Senator Sanders, Senator Wyden, Representative Susan Wild, and Representative Velázquez. These meetings were pivotal in building bipartisan support for our campaign and laying the foundation for future collaboration.

Mighty Earth Screening for Spanish Government with panel

November 2nd

Mighty Earth organized a panel in Madrid especially for members of the Spanish Government and press to discuss the importance of strengthening legislation that regulates importation of deforestation products. Three technical officials from the General Directorate of Biodiversity, Forests and Deforestation of the Ministry for Ecological Transition attended the screening and subsequent discussion. Based on their request, we aim to equip and educate communities for sustainable practices, fostering long-term autonomy and financial independence. Additionally, our focus extends to educational outreach and storytelling for change, where we will develop comprehensive educational materials, create a media platform for solution-based narratives, and distribute curriculum guides to educators in the U.S. Finally, we are primed to continue a global screening tour, leveraging diverse strategies to amplify the film's impact, engaging audiences worldwide, including policymakers and influencers, and fostering a united movement dedicated to the Amazon Rainforest's protection.
